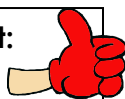
Local Council Elections – 5th May 2011

It's that time again – Local Elections – this includes Flamborough Parish Council.
All thirteen seats are up for election on 5th May 2011.

This is a chance to have your say on local issues affecting Flamborough.
This is a chance to contribute to making decisions that affect Flamborough.
This is a chance to make a difference to village services and community life.
If you have a keen interest in what happens to Flamborough and are prepared to make decisions, this role could be for you.

To be a Parish Councillor You Must:

- Be over 18 on the day of election and be a UK, EU or Commonwealth Citizen; **and**
- Be a local government elector for the parish, **or**
- have lived within the Parish (or within 3 miles of it) for the past 12 months; **or**
- have occupied as an owner or tenant any land or premises within the Parish for the past 12 months; **or**
- have had your main place of work within the Parish for the last 12 months

You cannot be a Councillor if:

- You work for the Parish Council; **or**
- You are an undischarged bankrupt; **or**
- You have been sentenced to more than three months imprisonment (whether suspended or not) within five years of the date of the election

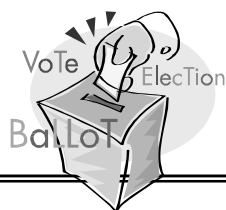

“COUNCIL CORNER” – Recent Parish Council decisions include:

Monday 29th November 2011

- The Council considered the budget and precept request for 2001-2012. The Council voted not to increase the precept which will remain at £34,500 and any budget requirements would be subsidised from reserves.

Monday 6th December 2011

- The Parish Council co-opted David Morton to join the Council to fill a vacancy.
- The Council felt that it did not wish to become involved with clearing snow and gritting footpaths and asked Community Payback to visit Flamborough to undertake some work.
- Councillor Sellick considered that a forward development plan is needed for the Council.
- The Council donated £50 to Flamborough School towards transport costs for children to take part in bicentenary celebrations of the foundation of Church Schools in York.
- The Council agreed to donate £50 towards HART Community Transport.
- The Council resolved that it was not necessary to employ a handyman.

Monday 10th January 2011

- The Council contacted the Police/ERYC regarding the status of the island at the junction of Post Office Street and Tower Street after traffic officers stopped motorists.
- The Council noted that the toilets were closed for 3 weeks due to frozen pipes. Emergency repairs had to be made when the thaw came and there were bursts. The Council agreed for a trace heating system to be installed to prevent this happening again.
- The Council reviewed Xmas Lighting and will provide a Christmas Tree each year as the small one in Camerons Gardens had died. Timer boxes and sockets will be installed on street lights and the Xmas Lights will be left up in Dog and Duck Square.
- Work to cut the hedge at the back of the allotments was considered along with specifications for work to the allotment gates, Fishermans Gardens and War Memorial.
- Work to prune trees at Camerons Gardens and Crofts Hill was approved.

Monday 7th February 2011

- Councillor Crossland proposed building an office above the bus shelter on Tower Street
- The Council considered the annual playground report and approved work to the railings at the War Memorial and a new Grounds Maintenance Contractor for 2011-2013.
- The Council objected to Yorkshire Wildlife Trust’s plans to develop a fruit orchard at South Landing as this would not be natural/native to the area; the fencing would be visually detrimental and it would encourage vandalism.
