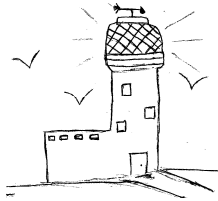

“Council Corner”

Recent Parish Council Decisions include:

Monday 7th March 2011:

- Flamborough said goodbye and thank you to PCSO Bev Feirn and welcomed PCSO Andrea Humphrey to work in the village.
- The Parish Council voted unanimously to approve ERYC’s proposals to isolate the Tower Street/Post Office Street junction from the “roundabout” island in the road and create road markings to allow a legal right turn from Tower Street into Post Office Street.
- The Council voted not to proceed with building an office above the bus shelter on Tower Street. Mr Morton painted the bus shelter and the Toilet Cleaner sweeps it out and disinfects it when needed.
- The Council agreed to re-furbish Fishermans Gardens by inseting an anchor into cobblestones and building a new planter – anyone wishing to donate or sponsor this project please get in touch.
- New Village Entry signs for the brick troughs were supplied.

Monday 4th April 2011:

- The Council looked at installing a light on the playground due to the amount of rubbish/bottles being found there and congregating youngsters after dark, but it was agreed to shelve the proposal. The Council will monitor the situation.
- The Council rejected a proposal to fund the PCSO’s transport to enable her to work between villages.
- Councillors Crossland and Villani attended an ERYC planning update seminar – ERYC are no further ahead with where Flamborough lies in the new Local Development Framework.
- The Council was pleased with the condition of the allotments – all plots are currently full and there is now a waiting list. New plots are planned at Charlie’s Gardens when this land is purchased from ERYC
- New allotment gates were installed and work to repair the railings at the War Memorial was completed.

Monday 16th May 2011:

- A drop post was agreed for the entrance to the Village Green to stop vehicles being driven onto the Green.
- New operator signs were ordered for the playground and the Council will chase up ERYC regarding the Dog Control Order sign.
- Dogs are NOT allowed in the playground and the Council urges all dog owners to pick up after their dogs on the Green and all areas within the Village – this is a massive problem.
- Bus shelter/store refurbishment was deferred. Office space for the Clerk was deferred until alternatives can be found and because of the huge budget implications involved.

Emergency Plan Questionnaire

ERYC recommends every community is prepared to help itself in the event of rare occasions when public resources are so stretched that assistance may not be readily available for some time - the Parish Council is therefore producing an Emergency Plan. Included with this newsletter is a questionnaire which is being sent to everyone in the village seeking to identify equipment and personnel who may be willing to help others in the event of a local disaster and also those who may need help or extra support in an emergency. Please spare the time to complete this form – any information you give will be held in the strictest confidence and used for no other purpose than the implementation of the Emergency Plan. Please place completed questionnaires in the box provided in the Post Office.

Quality Status

The Parish Council is delighted to have been re-accredited with Quality Status. The Council had to pass ten Government-set tests which were considered by the Accreditation Panel, membership of which is made by ministerial appointment. Re-accreditation provides assurance to the public and principal authority that independent assessment has been undertaken and a Quality Council is representative, competent and well managed. The award lasts for a four year period.
