The W I has been part of Flamborough village since 1941. At first the meetings were held in the Methodist rooms, then, after WWII, thanks to the generosity of Tom Waines making a Nissen hut available and the Fell family providing the land on which to site it, the WI had their own hall.

Over the years the WI members worked hard to make the hall comfortable and keep it weatherproof. During the Millenium year the decision was made to make the building more user friendly, so in 2005 after much fund-raising and grant applications, we had built a brick skin and new roof, committee/store room, new toilets including one for disabled people and a ramp for easier access.

As well as W I meetings and activities the hall is used by, and is available for hire, by other groups and organisations at £8.00 per hour, including use of kitchen facilities.

W I members also cater for parties wanting lunches, afternoon or high teas, or suppers, when they visit Flamborough and the Heritage Coast - "from a car load to a coach load" (max 60)
