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Saving Lives in Flamborough

After being earmarked as a possible location for a Community Public Access Defibrillator or cPAD by the Yorkshire Ambulance Service, the Parish Council unanimously voted to obtain a cPAD for the village. This was installed in the Village Hall in July.

A cPAD is an automated defibrillator located in an outdoor, weatherproof cabinet which is available 24 hours a day every day of the year, and allows access to life-saving equipment to anyone when a cardiac arrest is suspected.

In the event of an emergency a person dials 999 for an ambulance. The operator assesses the situation and, if appropriate, provides the caller with the combination code to access the cPAD. The operator will only release the code if a cardiac arrest is suspected and there is a second person on the scene that can retrieve the defibrillator from the cabinet. The operator will remain on the telephone to support the caller through hands only resuscitation and defibrillation until medical help arrives on scene.

Danes Dyke and South Landing Local Nature Reserves

East Riding of Yorkshire Council have appointed Haycock and Jay Associates Ltd to draw up a ten year management plan for Danes Dyke and South Landing. A public consultation is planned to seek residents views on how these sites should be managed to make sure they stay special and continue to be valued community assets.

The consultation will take place on Tuesday 16 September 2014 at the Village Hall between 3pm and 7pm with refreshments available.

Footway Improvement Works

Footpaths on Bridlington Road, Church Street, Castle Crescent, Woodcock Road and North Marine Road have been identified for improvement works. The work has been contracted to Hall's by East Riding of Yorkshire Council, with works commencing in September 2014, weather permitting. All residents affected by the works will receive a leaflet explaining the process and will be notified 24-48 hours before work takes place.

Broadband East Riding

The Broadband East Riding project is part of the national broadband programme. The project will make superfast broadband (of speeds more than 24Mbps) available to over 42,000 homes and businesses in the East Riding by December 2015. In addition, the project aims to ensure that the whole of the project area will have access to broadband speeds on at least 24Mbps by the same date. The second and third roll-out phases of the project have now been announced, with work commencing in July 2014 and running into the New Year and will include premises in Flamborough BT exchange areas. Businesses can also take advantage of all the benefits that this new technology will bring by accessing a free business support programme run by East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

East Riding Boundary Referendum

In March 2014, Hull City Council decided to establish a commission to look into what it sees as its restricted administrative boundaries and determine potential solutions including a boundary extension. In response to this, East Riding of Yorkshire Council resolved unanimously to strongly resist any attempts by Hull City Council to expand its boundary into the East Riding and to hold a referendum in September in the 12 parishes most likely to be affected by any boundary changes. Residents of these parishes will receive postal ballot papers from 8 September with the count taking place on 29 September. Those residents who do not live in the 12 parishes could still be affected by the proposals and can have their say on the issue by completing and returning a consultation form that will be published in September's edition of Your East Riding, which all households receive through the post.

"COUNCIL CORNER"

Recent Parish Council decisions include:

Monday 12th May 2014:

- The pump at Crofts Hill was fenced off to make the structure safe until such time as it could be repaired.
- The Jubilee Seat was removed as it was not repairable and a replacement was approved.
- Following damage to the shelter next to the WI Hall, the Council agreed to undertake repairs to remove the graffiti, replace a broken board and general tidy the area up.
- A new laptop was purchased for use by the Clerk as the old computer no longer worked.

Monday 2nd June 2014:

- The Council will no longer provide separate surgery sessions for members of the public due to poor uptake of the facility, residents can contact Councillors or the Clerk directly with any concerns or take advantage of the public participation sessions of Council meetings.

Monday 7th July 2014:

- A request for traffic calming surveys to be undertaken at Lower Lighthouse Road, Crofts Hill and North Marine Road has been submitted to East Riding of Yorkshire Council.
- A review of the Clerk's working facilities is ongoing.
- A new shelter for the parking ticket machine at Danes Dyke was erected by East Riding of Yorkshire Council.
